





#### Context

The agricultural sector is a major source of livelihood for a large portion of the population and a significant contributor to the economy in Nepal (approximately 27 percent of the country's GDP). However, the sector is highly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change, due to the changing patterns of rainfall, rising temperatures, and increasing frequency and intensity of natural disasters. Though country has climate change-related policy documents and legal frameworks in place at the national level, internalizing climate actions in local plans, programs, and budgets is challenged by limited institutional, technical, and financial capacity and knowledge at provincial and local level.

The goal of field of action 1 is to support the creation of a more sustainable and resilient local economy that supports agricultural development and mitigates the impact of climate change in working municipalities.

GRAPE supports municipalities in fulfilling their role in creating framework conditions for local green economic development and in identifying development priorities in light of climate change. The aims is that municipalities take these into account in their planning processes. The programme supports the implementation of The programme ensures regular communication with various federal and provincial ministries, however, the lead Ministry is the Ministry of Land Management Cooperatives and Poverty Alleviation.
